## TTYL - Talking to Youth Live - To promote and encourage mental wellness with Grade 8 students.

On **Thursday**, **November 13**<sup>th</sup>, the **Grade 8** students from Elrose, Eston, Dinsmore, Kyle, Beechy and Lucky Lake schools will participate in the TTYL Program in Elrose. The students will be split into small groups, rotating through 5 game-format sessions.
