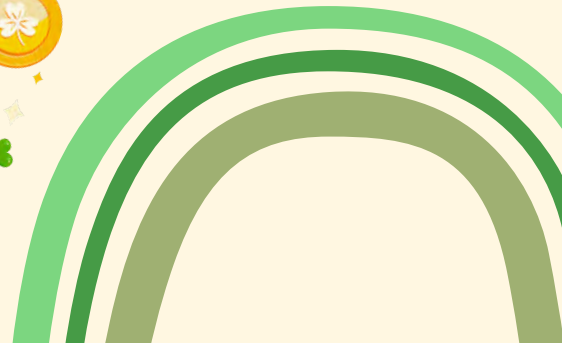

NEW MISSION, VISION, & VALUES ADOPTED

At its regular February 24 meeting, and as part of developing its next long-term strategic plan, Trustees adopted a new mission statement, vision statement, and core values for Sun West School Division.
