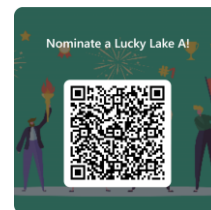

- **Current Situation**- Creating a supportive, healthy and inclusive environment(s) where students and staff can thrive emotionally, socially and physically at school and beyond.
- **Action & Deliverables**- Guest Speakers, Morning Snack Programs, Community Closer and Pantry, Land Acknowledgement with SLT provided donations, Roots of Empathy, Learning Lounge, Monthly Assemblies, Art Events, Physical Activity Events.

SCC asked to possibly assist or contribute to: classroom libraries, student authored book processing, pickup and delivery from the city, guest readers for I Love To Read Month, creating task kits.

6.2 **SCC Engagement & Alignment Plan** for 25-26 completed plan will be available at November meeting. In aligning with the SLIP goals, SCC has planned for a Literacy Info Evening for families focused on Structured Reading and support at home. During Family Literacy Week in January, a "Story Skate" is in the works. Aligning with Wellness Goals, Kendra expressed the need for a playground upgrade. With the success of the Local, we would like to target these funds to this and get the fundraising started. SCC would like to take advantage of the Sask Parks and Recreation grant that is being offered- with the possibility of up to \$50,000 is matched. 6.3 **SCC Budget** is still in progress and will be presented at the November meeting due to time restrictions. Still waiting on the arrival of the \$2500 SunWest grant. ## TOUR OF KYLE RENOVATIONS

### OCTOBER 2025 HAPPENINGS

The Board of Education held a Committee of the Whole meeting on October 7 and its regular meeting on October 21. Highlights of these meetings included:

- Trustees received the Distance Learning report that indicated Sun West students earned 1177 distance learning credits and have a 98.6% success rate.
- Trustees received the Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment Report, which covered the wide array of learning programs within Sun West.
- As required by the *Education Act*, the Board held its annual Organizational Meeting on October 21. At this meeting, the Chair and Vice-Chair are selected for a one-year term. The current Chair, Michele Whitfield (Subdivision 1) and Vice-Chair, Cathy Morrow (Subdivision 7) were chosen to continue in these roles for the upcoming year. Committee roles for the next year were also assigned at this meeting.
- Following the Committee of the Whole meeting, the Trustees and senior administration travelled to Kyle Composite School to view the completed renovation.


