Welcome Our Newest Teacher, Lucas Ylioja

Mrs. Ayers' Grade 3 and 4 class will be welcoming a very special new teacher this year—baby Lucas Ylioja. Lucas, born in September to proud parents Alica and Davin Ylioja, will be joining the class once a month with his mom as part of the Roots of Empathy program.

Roots of Empathy is an internationally recognized classroom program that helps students build empathy, kindness, and understanding by observing and learning from the development of a baby. The program uses the unique perspective of seeing the world through a baby's eyes to encourage students to reflect on feelings, relationships, and caring for others.

Throughout the year, the students will witness baby Lucas grow and reach new milestones. They will learn about important aspects of child development such as sleep patterns, nutrition, how babies use their senses (like taste and sight), and how they begin to show preferences for certain things. Each visit will spark conversations about how babies communicate their needs and feelings—even before they can use words.

At its core, the program teaches children that babies grow best when surrounded by love and care. Students will explore what love looks like in action, such as keeping babies safe and healthy by preventing Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD) and Shaken Baby Syndrome. These important lessons help students understand not only how babies thrive, but also how empathy, protection, and compassion are essential for everyone.

- 1. Call to Order -The meeting was called to order by Kendra at 5:05pm
- **2. Reading and Approval of Minutes** -The minutes from the last meeting, held on May 13th, were circulated before the meeting and approved as presented.
- 3. Approval of the Agenda -The amended agenda was approved as presented.
- 4. Reports Full reports are attached in the SCC binder.
 - **4.1 Treasurer's Report** Presented by Kendra:

Opening Balance as of May 1st, 2025: \$2510.39

Closing Balance as of May 30th, 2025: \$508.30

Summary of expenses: Home Ec Room items, teacher appreciation cart, Grad Gift contribution, Blackstone, Flowers and Pots, SCC t-shirts, hot lunch supplies, new cheques.

4.2 Principal's Report – Presented by Jennifer:

Summary: Scholarship recipients, Kindergarten Discovery Day, Upcoming High School Awards, looking for Roots of Empathy volunteer, Saskatoon Berries game recap, staff farewells.

5. Old Business

- **5.1 Review & Feedback on 24-25 SLIP Goals** At time of meeting, only a summary of review is available. At the time of minutes typed, complete SLIP goal review was sent to SCC Chair and forwarded to the rest of council via email. Also attached in binder. Discussed in WhatsApp chat- the desire to hold a separate meeting in September to go over created goals and again in June to dedicate to the review. SCC strongly encourage parents to attend these meetings.
- **5.2 Drop Your Backpack** Staff decided collectively that this event will not happen this August. Is this something that parents would participate in? Possible Facebook poll to ask next year?
- 5.3 Back to School BBQ tabled until August meeting. Tentative date of September 11th.
- **5.4 Welcome to LLS Clothing** for kindergarten and staff will not be facilitated by SCC as discussed last meeting. Also noted that SCC will not purchase or order Grad hoodies, as the graduates enjoy designing these themselves and grad parent usually volunteers to order these.
- **5.5 High School Awards** scheduled for June 20th at 2pm.
- **5.6 Yearbook Ad** will be purchased for \$60.00 after a motion by Deenna, seconded by Jody. This price gets us a double horizontal size. Deenna will create and email ad to committee.
- **5.7** Jennifer presented a couple options for **school supplies**, including: A single school fee covering all supplies. Bulk order delivered to staff. Kendra mentioned partnering with an online company to deliver supplies to the school or

home. SCC encourage staff to review supply lists to ensure they remain affordable for families. It was noted that Lucky Lake School has previously had one of the longest supply lists in SunWest.

- 5.8 Fundraising Ad Booklet Lucky Lake Local The proposed fundraising ad booklet was presented under the title Lucky Lake Local. Questions were raised about its long-term viability, and SCC agreed to trial it for one year. The booklet would be published monthly and dependent on sponsor participation. Lucky Lake School has agreed to provide printing once each edition is approved by administration. Jennifer will provide SCC with pricing for both letter and legal sizes. A committee will be formed and meet over the summer to finalize details. Jennifer will also confirm Sun West's support with Superintendent Kim Fick.
- **5.9 LifeVac** is "not endorsed by public health". SCC will not be purchasing this device for the school.
- 5.10 Camping Trips After the request for the annual Grade 7/8 school camping trip was denied due to short notice and staff availability, two separate privately organized camping trips were planned in June for Grades 7/8 and 10/11. These events were facilitated by a community member with parent support, and all students in the respective grades were invited via text to parents.
 - Ms. Young and Mr. Beeson both expressed concern that school administration was not informed of the intent or details of these events. They requested that, in future, even if events are parent, or community-led, administration be made aware when the event was previously organized by the school.
- **5.11** SCC asked about the possibility of out-of-province field trips. Most notably, is an overnight **Drumheller and Tyrel Museum** visit. Kendra and Deenna have details emailed from the Tyrel Museum.

6. New Business

- **6.1 Welcome to our new SCC Treasurer.** Thank you, Melanie Dyck for volunteering your time! Signing authority will remove Melissa Blough and have Melanie Dyck added at Prairie Credit Union.
- **6.2 Staff Update** has us welcoming Ms. Vicki Chen as LLS's new Sr. Sciences and Math teacher. Advertised is a Health and Phys. Ed teacher for the first semester of the 25-26 year.
- **6.3** Review of the former Student Handbook, now **School Community Handbook** changes welcomed. Still being revised.
- **6.4 SCC Budget** is tabled to allow Melanie to review and become familiar with SCC financial history and once signing authority to change.
- **6.5 Fundraising Ideas for 25-26** SCC will host a BBQ lunch fundraiser in July. Thank you to our event sponsor- Simplot! **6.6** The annual **art contest**, facilitated by the previous administration and sponsored framing by the SCC, received no entries this year. SCC agreed it may have run its course and have decided to move on from this initiative.
- **6.7 Summer Reading Initiative** Jennifer hopes to have a calendar and incentives to promote literacy for students over the summer. Details yet to be finalized.
- **6.8** SCC would like to show their **staff appreciation** and provide a member-donated year end lunch. Jennifer suggested June 27th for their backyard staff windup- 23 staff.

- **6.9 Staff Gifts**. In WhatsUp SCC Chat, a motion made by Deenna to spend \$15 each for Ms. Wagner and Ms. Fraser and \$50 on Ms. Heslip. Kendra and Deenna will create cup holder gift baskets with a plant, drink, donut and gift card.
- **6.10 Exterior Appearance of School** Ongoing concerns were raised about the school's exterior, including: overgrown grass in play areas, weeds on the track, field, and parking lots, chipping paint on exterior doors, the faded yellow bus lane line, improper use of garbage cans, and the need for regular tree trimming and weed whipping. Questions were raised in the SCC WhatsApp chat about whether maintenance like this could be contracted out, similar to snow removal. Members agreed that maintaining a clean and cared-for school interior and exterior reflects pride in our school.

- 1. Call to Order -The meeting was called to order by Kendra at 5:23pm
- **2. Reading and Approval of Minutes** -The minutes from the last meeting, held on June 15th, were circulated before the meeting and approved as presented.
- **3. Approval of the Agenda** -The agenda was approved as presented.
- 4. Reports Full reports are attached in the SCC binder.
 - **4.3 Treasurer's Report** Presented by Melanie:

Opening Balance as of July after BBQ: \$2728.83

Summary of expenses: BBQ supplies.

Expected Expenses: Yearbook Ad- \$60, Retirement Gift-\$200, Teacher Gift Card-\$25, BBQ expenses \$101.41, Canopy-\$269.94 (Motion made by Kendra in WhatsApp to purchase on July 8th. Jody seconded.)

4.4 Lucky Lake Local Committee - Presented by Deenna:

Kendra, Mel, and Deenna met on August 6th to finalize details. Advertising costs were set, the decision was made to use legal size, and an email account was created for communication and e-transfer (once signing authority is complete). This email will also be available for general SCC business. The SCC is still waiting to hear from the school regarding printing costs; SCC will supply paper if it results in savings. Deenna will follow up with the school by email. She will also complete letters for businesses and sponsors. The goal is to have the first issue published in October.

5. Old Business

- **5.12** Summer BBQ Fundraisers were a huge success! July 8th was sponsored by Simplot with a grand total raised of \$2197.00 and August 15th BBQ had burgers sponsored Nutrien with a total of \$1249.00. VBS sponsored lunch to participants and families were unknown to us, so something to plan for next year. Thanks again to Simplot, Nutrien, Wild West Steelhead for ice, as well as Mr. Graham Richardson for making sure our Blackstone was set out for pickup and put away after!
- **5.13 Exterior Appearance of the School-** The grass has been cut several times, weeds have been sprayed, and SCC was informed that the school now has a weed wacker. Overall, the parking lot and grounds are looking great. Still needing attention are the removal of dead trees, trimming of branches, painting of exterior doors, repainting of the bus line, and completion of unfinished construction at the front of the school, including the light post and handicapped parking spot.

6. New Business

- **6.1 Fundraising Ideas -** The SCC discussed a potential fundraiser with the Fudge Factory, a Moose Jaw company that creates fudge and flavored popcorn, with 40% of sales going back to the SCC. This could be a great option for Christmas, with a possible November start and samples available at Parent/Teacher Conferences. With the Kinettes no longer offering Mom's Pantry, SCC considered the possibility of taking it on instead. Mel noted that the minimum requirement is \$4,000 in sales, otherwise a \$500 delivery fee applies. Discussion will continue at the September meeting.
- **6.2 Hot Lunch Committee-** Coordinator is needed to plan about 10 hot lunches with SCC fully supporting with helpers and funding. Deenna will create a poster to advertise this. The coordinator is not obligated in any way to join SCC.
- **6.3 Back to School BBQ –** Tentative date for September 11th. SCC will reach out to Michelle Berndt to see if she would be interested in planning an activity for our draw prize. (Kendra made a motion in WhatsApp to purchase 6 drawstring bags with the LLS logo from Athletes Haven at a cost of \$15 per bag to be used for these purposes. Megan seconded.) Burgers, pop and chips will be on the menu. We will wait until the start of school for student numbers for ordering. Recipe Books from past fundraiser will be available for free at BBQ.
- **6.4 Lucky Lake School Clothing** Clothing samples will be available from Athlete's Haven at the Back to School BBQ. Watch for new items! Volleyball warmup shirts will also be available for LLS athletes if desired.
- **6.5 Future Meeting Dates** are tentatively being planned for the third Monday of every month, with exception of the November SunWest Annual Meeting that is broadcasted with our Regular Meeting to follow. SCC would also like to schedule separate meetings for SLIP goal reviews.
