


Dear Gift Givers,

BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

OCTOBER HAPPENINGS

The Board of Education held its annual seminar from October 15-17, where they discussed current, ongoing and long-term trends and issues in education. Presentations were made on: the Sun West Education Plan, Board Policy Review, Enterprise Risk Management, Indigenous Education Responsibility Framework and innovative programming through the Saskatoon Public Schools Foundation. Trustees also worked on strategies to enhance their problem-solving and decision-making capacities.

The Board held its regular meeting on October 24 where topics included :

- The Board heard the Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment Report, which detailed the ongoing successes of Sun West students.
- Information on initiatives being examined such as Destination Imagination.
- Resolutions to the upcoming Saskatchewan School Boards Association Convention were considered.



Every year, the Board supports a group of Sun West school student leaders and staff adviors in attending the annual Canadian Student Leadership Conference. Hundreds of students from across Canada attend and this year it was in St. John, New Brunswick. Pictured above is the Sun West delegation that included students from Kenaston, Davidson, Eston Composite, Kindersley Composite, Rosetown Central High and Loreburn Central Schools.
