



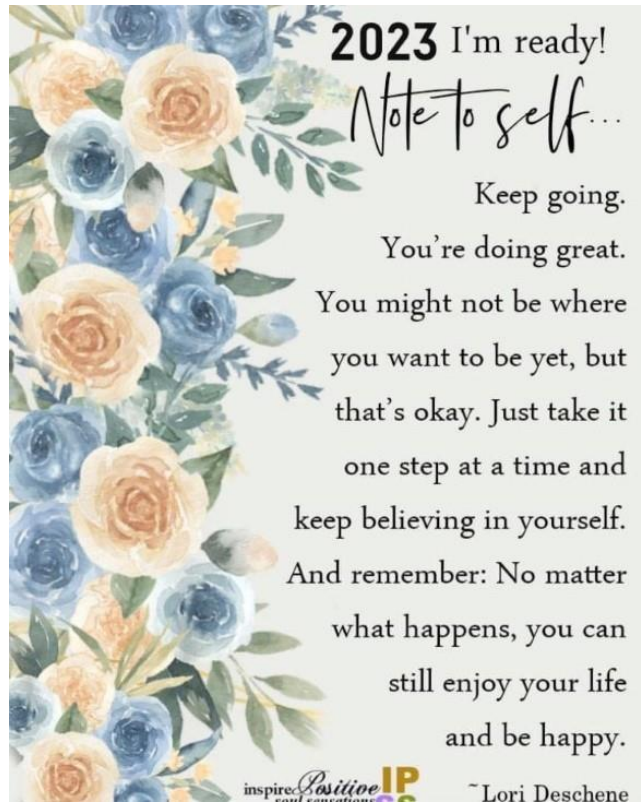

AUTO BODY: Learn vehicle panel repair preparation, and painting techniques.

AUTOMOTIVE SERVICE TECHNICIAN: Learn to perform a variety of vehicle checks, an oil and filter change, and a tire change.

PARTS MANAGEMENT TECHNICIAN: Learn how to identify and look up basic parts using various types of technology.

CARPENTRY: You will learn safe and proper use of hand and power tools as you construct a take home project, and see that a number of tools can solve any one woodworking problem.
