## Saskatchewan's Most Informed Student

All grade 6-12 students in Saskatchewan are eligible to compete. This competition runs from April 4- 13 or until the \$4,000 prize pot is depleted. Students can answer up to 10 post-secondary and career exploration questions a day. By answering 50 questions correct during the competition dates students earn a \$20 bursary. Following April 13, make sure to watch your progress on the national student leaderboard and continue quizzing to earn more!

## Saskatchewan's Most Informed School

ChatterHigh and Skills Canada Saskatchewan have partnered together to run a 10-day career exploration competition from April 4-13. This 'A' Leaderboard is for middle and high schools in SK with under 100 students. This competition will jump-start the national Let's Talk Careers Competition. Following April 13, make sure to continue competing and watching your school and student progress on the national leaderboards until May 20.
