There have been many discussions about the proposed alternate school calendar pilot. Like most things in life, I feel there are pros and cons. Depending on the grade and activities outside of school, families are making informed decisions. We have 90 families who can vote (grade 12 parents don't vote unless they have younger children in school). As of yesterday, we have had 50 families vote. The division requires 75% of families to vote, which is 68 families. Of those families voting 70% need to be in favour of going ahead with the pilot. 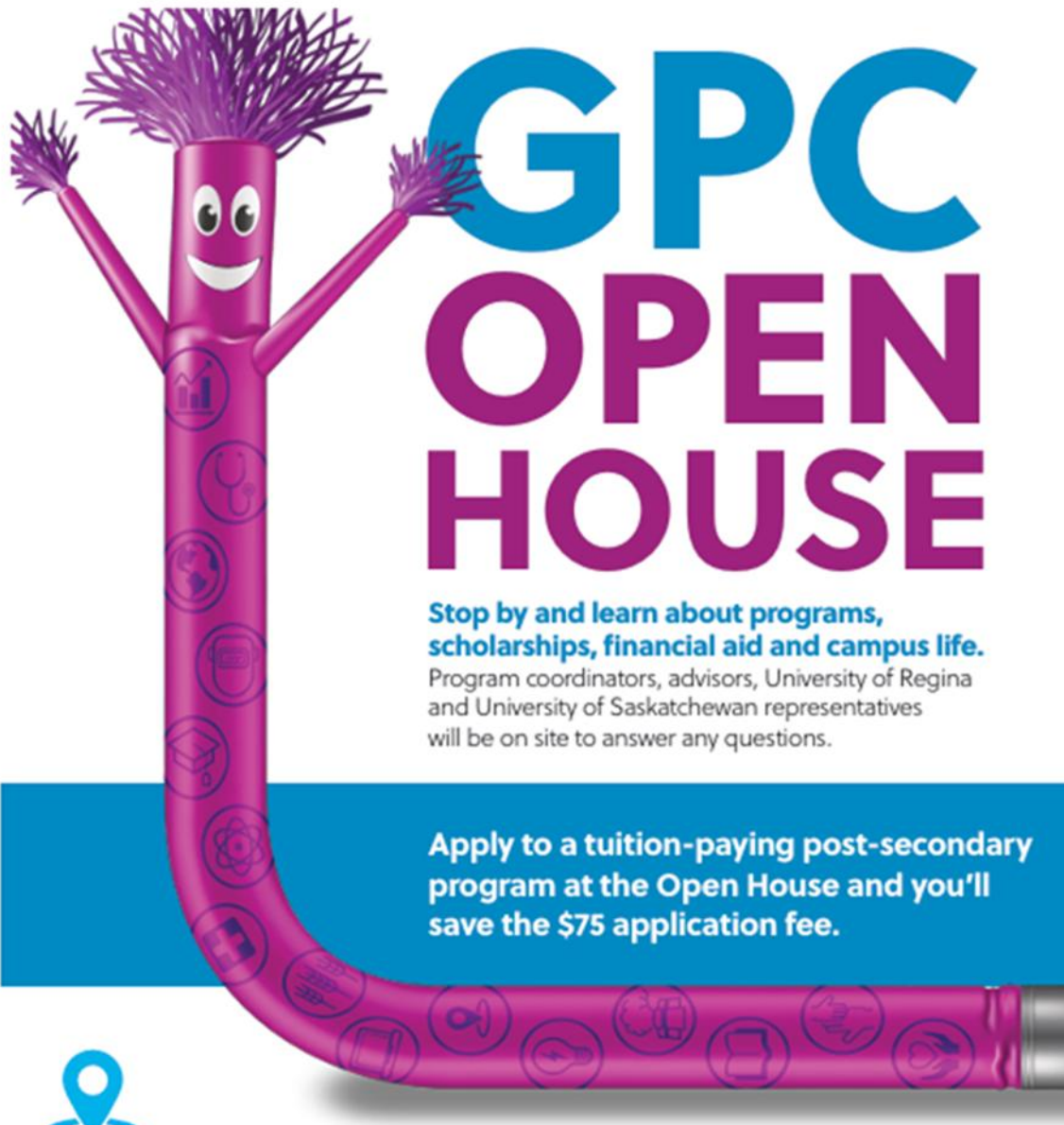
