

The Board spoke candidly to Mr. Bachmann about a range of issues impacting education in Saskatchewan, where SSBA leadership would be beneficial.

SEPTEMBER HAPPENINGS

The Board of Education held a Committee of the Whole Meeting on September 12 and a regular Board Meeting on September 26. Significant developments included:

- It was reported that Sun West's enrollment sits at 4,707, which is slightly higher than projections.
- Board members started an examination of proposed changes to Board policies made during the Board Policy Review, in preparation for formalizing these changes later in the year.
- The Board heard reports on Facilities, Transportation and Information Technology. Sun West continues to be innovative in the maintenance and renovaton of its buildings, which is saving money and keeping facilities in good running order. Finding school bus drivers continues to be a challenge for Transportation but recruitment efforts on several fronts are wielding positive results. Information Technology continues to be an area where Sun West is staying ahead of the curve.



At their September 26 regular meeting, the Board of Education and senior administration wore orange to recognize the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, which was on September 30. Wearing orange demonstrates support for the survivors of Canada's residential school system and honours the memory of the thousands of children who did not survive residential schools.
