

Any Grade 10-12 students interested in pursuing the skilled trades have an opportunity to enrol in SYA. This is basically an extra-curricular career investigation opportunity with huge benefits to students. In addition to exploring a trade or trades of interest, successful completion means future waiver of indenturing fee, no charge for Level 1 technical training, and 300 hours of trade time credit. Please speak with your Career Counsellor for details.

myBlueprint is available to Grade 9 through 12 students in support of Graduation and Post Graduation Plan. The transition to post-secondary can be daunting for students (and their parents!). Whether they are entering a college, university program, apprenticeship, the workforce, volunteering, planning a gap year, etc. students will experience changes. Our Career Counsellors can help support the use of myBlueprint as a tool for life/career planning and investigation. This tool can help students/families:

1. Research high school courses that are required for post-secondary programs of interest.
2. Research post-secondary programs so they are aware of important dates and resources available to them.
3. Develop a budget to finance their post-secondary pathway, etc.

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# Monthly Timeline for Grade 12 Students

## November

- Continue researching opportunities in alignment with your life/career plan.
- Access your Allies! (Talk to Career Counsellors, Teachers, Parents, Family, Friends about possibilities)
- Continue to research, prepare, and apply for scholarships.
- Many Universities offer Early Admissions and Early Entrance Scholarships. Watch deadlines!
- Watch deadlines and apply for Residence such as:
  - [Apply for Residence at University of Saskatchewan](#)
- Register for events to support life/career planning.

## December /January

- Prepare for Semester 1 final exams.
- Review timetable for Sem 2 and talk to Career Counsellor/Principal about any potential adjustments.
- Continue to apply for programs of interest.
- Continue to research, prepare, and apply for scholarships.
- Many Universities offer Early Admissions and Early Entrance Scholarships. Watch deadlines!
- If post-secondary institutions require official transcripts after January exams, be sure to order them from the Ministry of Education. <https://www.k12.gov.sk.ca/etranscript/>

## February

- Connect with your school's Career Counsellor
- Continue applying for scholarships.
- February 15<sup>th</sup> is a 'common' deadline for competitive entry colleges at SK Post-secondary institutions.
- Check deadlines for out of province schools.
- SKPoly High Demand program deadline – February 15<sup>th</sup>

## March

- Continue applications
- Official Ministry Transcripts due to SKPoly for Nursing and high demand programs – March 1

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# Monthly Timeline for Grade 12 Students

## April

- Continue to apply for programs of interest
- Apply for local scholarships – check with your Career Counsellor, School Principal, etc. for details so you do not miss deadlines.

## May

- Connect with your school's Career Counsellor
- If interested in summer or full-time/part-time, etc. employment, begin to investigate job opportunities, update resume, brush up on interview skills, etc.
- For those planning for post-secondary studies, watch email and student accounts for updates regarding registration, orientation days, etc.
- Update your myBlueprint Grad Plan Portfolio with any current skills, update your resume, add any certifications or showcases, reflect on your learnings, share your portfolio with your Career Counsellor and a trusted adult, etc.

## June

- Update your myBlueprint Grad Plan Portfolio with any current skills, update your resume, add any certifications or showcases, reflect on your learnings, share your portfolio with your Career Counsellor and a trusted adult, etc.
- Grade 12's may change email information in myBlueprint as prompted by the system in order to continue utilizing the resource after graduation. (We have had several students appreciate access to their resumes and planning after high school!)
- If planning a Gap Year, prepare next steps
- If planning to work, prepare next steps.
- If attending post-secondary institutions, you may need to request official transcripts to be sent after June exams. For this form, go to: <https://www.k12.gov.sk.ca/etranscript/>





# Women in Skilled Trades

## WOMEN IN SKILLED TRADES INITIATIVE OVERVIEW

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The Saskatchewan Apprenticeship and Trade Certification Commission (SATCC) has implemented a new initiative aimed at attracting women to the skilled trades and helping them achieve journeyperson certification.

From **January 8, 2024 until June 30, 2026**, women who register within these dates in eligible Red Seal trades will receive a rebate on their apprenticeship registration fee and Level 1 technical training tuition. Fees are required to be paid up front through MyATC. However, the full amount will be refunded to whoever paid the fees.

During this time, SATCC is also employing two Consultants to coach and mentor women apprentices in the eligible Red Seal trades and their employers. 

# Scholarships

Saskatchewan Advantage Scholarship is awarded to ALL Saskatchewan grade 12 graduates who are enrolled in a Saskatchewan post-secondary institution in a recognized program of study. This is worth \$500/year up to a maximum of \$2,000 and is automatically applied to tuition.

Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship Industry Scholarship are awarded to 120 students who complete the Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship passport each year. Schools nominate a potential candidate and winners are announced in June. Many Sun West students received this scholarship! Congratulations! 
